

PLACES TO CHECK FOR ACCURATE GROUP MEETING INFORMATION

www.southvalleyanon.org

This is our local website. Click on MEETINGS. There are three places to check and see if your information is accurate. There is 1) the **scrolling list** for the next available meeting, 2) the **Color-Coded Printable Version**, and 3) if you have a temporary electronic meeting also check the **Virtual Printable Version**.

www.northerncaliforniaal-anon.org

This is our Northern California World Service Area (NCWSA) website. Click on MEETINGS. There is only one place you need to check here. Scroll down to the middle of the page and click on the **Temporary Electronic Meetings in Northern California (spreadsheet)** button. They are arranged in day-of-meeting order. The other links to meetings on this website take you to this next section for WSO.

www.al-anon.org

This is our World Service Organization (WSO) website. Click on Meetings. There is only one place you need to check here. Click on **Find An Al-Anon Meeting**. In the Find A Group Meeting box, type in your city and state. Make sure the Al-Anon meetings box has a blue checkmark, select your meeting language and day of the week you meet. If you meet more than one day a week, you will need to check the listing for each day. Once those boxes are checked you can scroll down the list of meetings to the left of the map until you find yours. All active meetings should be listed here regardless of how you are meeting. Temporary electronic meeting information should be noted here.

As Al-Anon's primary purpose is to help families and friends of alcoholics, it is important that newcomers, as well as other members, are able to find accurate information regarding meetings. Therefore, we are asking each group to please review the areas where their meeting information is listed and check for accuracy of meeting day, time and location for both physical and temporary electronic meetings, as there have been reports of people showing up to empty locked meeting rooms or attempting to log on to mis-listed electronic meetings. This check can be considered an act of service for your meeting. Quoting from How Al-Anon Works, page 120, on Tradition Eleven: "It is important that those who need what Al-Anon offers have the opportunity to hear about us. Each of us has benefitted from the accessibility of the Al-Anon program, and it is important that we remain visible and available to those who seek our help." The attached sheet is provided as a guide to check Al-Anon's websites for your meeting information. Please also check signs or anywhere else information may be posted for your meeting.
